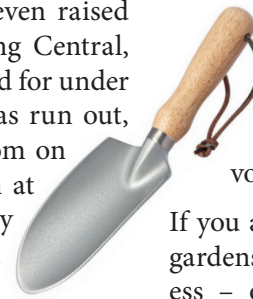
The Gardening Corner
