Taft High School recently achieved a Level One quality rating from Chicago Public Schools — designating Taft as a “high performing” institution and “a good school choice” for Edgebrook residents.

- 97% of Taft students were accepted to a College or a University last year.

The ECA’s Snow Plowing Efforts

The City of Chicago’s primary concern is keeping major traffic arteries clear from snow. Plowing side streets is a much lower priority. The ECA, on the other hand, is concerned about emergency vehicle access to our side streets, as well as egress for parked cars so that our neighbors can go about their business.

The ECA’s service plows a single path down the middle of the side streets when snowfall exceeds 4 inches.
