

## The Garden Corner

You've no doubt seen Mary Jo Garnier up to her elbows in mulch—planting and seeding, panting and weeding—in downtown Edgebrook at dusk or dawn. That's the sort of perk that goes with the lofty title ECA Beautification Director. In what may become a regular column, Mary Jo issues an alert about a nasty little critter on the loose—the bagworm.

Bagworms have been found in trees and shrubs along Devon and Central. They can defoliate conifers and deciduous trees, thereby killing them.

The Chicago forestry department has been notified and should mechanically remove them later in the fall when the leaves drop and the bagworms are more obvious.

Meanwhile, residents should check their own yards for these voracious pests. One control method that I particularly like is to attract a natural enemy to the bagworm. A University of Illinois study found that planting flowers from the Asteraceae family attracts one of the bagworm's few predators—parasitoid insects. Put in some Shasta daisies, New England Aster or Gazania nearby and let nature take care of those bagworms for you!


