You'll keep your AC performing at an efficient level for a longer period of time. But remember to keep the cover four inches from the ground. And, no, rain and snow won't keep your AC clean.

### The Gardening Corner

#### House Plants

By now, any plant that has been living outside should be inside where it is warm and cozy. I hope that, before bringing them in, the plants got a fierce spray of water to remove any hitchhiking bugs. To keep plants thriving through the winter, water only when dry – check first by testing for moistness about an inch down. When you water, watch for bottom-of-the-pot runoff, a sure sign the plant has enough moisture.

To compensate for the dryness in the house, set the pot on top of a dish filled with small stones such as pea gravel. Water the stones. This creates a moist area around the plant.

Winter is not a good time to fertilize, but, if you must, use only ½ strength and only once a month. Happy Gardening!

We are happy to report that the EPA investigation of the Jinny Mose Triangle Garden at Caldwell, LeHigh and Devon turned up only an old muffler and hub cap, but no toxic substances or gas containers.

The ECA has partnered with Greencorps, Chicago for sev-

eral years and our community has benefited from their generosity in plant, seed and bulb distributions. In 2011 the garden was awarded a 3-year grant to increase native plantings to provide habitat for birds and butterflies. The grant was put on hold during

the EPA investigation.

Greencorps will now be able to finish the landscaping work this fall. We would like to thank Nelson Chueng of the City of Chicago and Edde Jones of Greencorps for their continued support.
